INVESTING IN LAKE WINNIPEG AND LAKE OF THE WOODS

We have a moral obligation to protect that which sustains life today and for future generations.

The Federal Government recently launched the Canada Water Agency, which will be located here in Winnipeg. It will work together with the provinces, territories, Indigenous communities, local governments, and scientists, to keep our water safe, clean and well-managed.

In addition, the Federal
Government is investing \$650
million over 10 years to protect
and restore the water quality and
ecosystem health of our major
watersheds across the country.

This includes tens of millions of dollars to support Lake Winnipeg and Lake of the Woods, which are, along with the Great Lakes, specifically identified to receive support.

Many residents of our riding enjoy spending time at their cottages, going camping, and making day trips that form some of their most cherished memories with family.

I am proud that we are investing in science-based approaches to protecting our water so that future generations can benefit from the beauty that surrounds us.



SUPPORTING UKRAINE

Canada's steadfast support for Ukraine continues.

In the spirit of strengthening our ties to Ukraine and showing our support for their fight against Putin's illegal and cruel invasion, I continue to engage with the Ukrainian community across our city.

Recently, I visited the Oseredok Ukrainian Cultural and Educational Centre, met with leaders from the Ukrainian Canadian Congress, and took in a delicious perogy dinner with community members at the Holy Family Ukrainian Catholic Church.

Our riding is home to a large population with Ukrainian heritage. Manitoba has been a national leader in welcoming thousands fleeing the war at home.

Our renewed Canada-Ukraine free trade agreement is one of

the key ways that we are defending the interest of our ally at this critical time.

I was proud to rise in the House of Commons on several instances to speak in favour of this deal, which has since passed.

Unfortunately, the Conservatives remain the only political party who do not support the deal that President Zelenskyy himself asked Canada to pursue.

CARING FOR OUR LAND

As the climate crisis progresses, taking concrete measures to protect our environment is as important as ever.

I joined our Minister of Environment and Climate Change, along with Indigenous nations, and the government of Manitoba, in signing an agreement to protect the Seal River watershed in Northern Manitoba, one of the world's largest watersheds. This is a critical step in our joint efforts to fight climate change, preserve and protect land, and work with Indigenous partners in a spirit of reconciliation.

It is also an example of the crosspartisan relationship growing between our governments on behalf of Manitobans.

I was happy to be able to facilitate a meeting between the Minister and Sustainable South Osborne. Founded in 2009, this organization converted barren public land into fruitful community gardens and orchards.

They share their produce with members of the community and those in need, and they host an amazing harvest dinner. We discussed their endeavors to support sustainable food systems in Winnipeg South Centre.

MOTION M-86: CITIZEN'S ASSEMBLY ON ELECTORAL REFORM

Motion M-86 called for the creation of a "Canadian citizens' assembly on electoral reform, which would...determine if electoral reform is recommended for Canada, and if so recommend specific measures that would foster a healthier democracy."

I know that there are many in our riding who remain disappointed that changes to our system have not occurred. After discussions with constituents over the past six months, I am aware that electoral reform remains an issue that matters to people in Winnipeg South Centre.

I voted in favour of M-86 because I recognize that there are gaps in our electoral system. It was also a way for me to ensure that I reflected the interests and values of my constituents in Parliament.

I am always keen to engage with anyone who is looking to enhance the quality of our democracy.

I want to thank those of you who reached out to share your views on this motion, and for bringing your ideas, energy, and passion to a topic that deserves the space for future dialogue.

HEALTH AND DENTAL CARE

The number one issue on the minds of voters I speak to is health care.

Whether it is long wait times, doctor shortages, mental health and addictions services, or supports for older adults, people are worried about the quality of our system.

Recently, I joined my colleagues in welcoming the Prime Minister to Winnipeg, where alongside

Premier Wab Kinew, we announced an historic investment in Manitoba's health care system.

Over \$630 million from the Federal Government will be invested directly into Manitoba. Specific measures are in place to ensure money is being spent on areas of core concern, like those listed above.

In addition to this deal, the new Canadian Dental Care Plan, which offers lower income earners, starting with older adults in Canada, is up and running.
